Principal's message

We are half way through the year and it is finally calmer throughout the building. We have our portable in use for music and our last classroom renovated and ringing with student learning. Unfortunately we had to see a great community partner, KidsQuest leave our site to go farther afield because of our growth. This site is blessed with excellent teaching and learning in the school and it shows to our visitors. We are often praised for the quality teaching and commitment we have to student learning and the 'vibe' as visitors walk in. We are very proud of this site! One thing we want to improve on is our late students and the resulting loss of instructional time during the morning routine. We notice that when children arrive late this causes interruptions at the classroom door and with the children settling in late

the teacher is losing approximately 10-15 minutes each day getting that child 'up to speed'. That is over an hour a week!

We are asking for all parents to help us decrease this loss of instructional time by making sure your children arrive at school by 8:45 every morning. The bell rings at 8:40 to let children into the building from the playground. After children enter the building important time is spent preparing them for the day. Also for the safety of your children, and to minimize interruptions at the classroom door, we are going to be very diligent in enforcing the expectation of not taking your children to the classroom door or delivering any items to them in the classroom during the school day. This sometimes takes teachers away from the classroom for up to ten minutes

by parents wanting to speak to the teacher about a particular concern. The best time to communicate with your child's teacher is afterschool, by e-mail or notes sent with students indicating you would like them to contact you. Schools are very busy places so please help us to provide the safest and most efficient educational experience for all children by having your children to school on time and avoiding class disruptions.
